

2016 ALAP & ABEP Congress

The VII Congress of the Latin American Population Association (ALAP) and the XX Congress of the Brazilian Population Association (ABEP) will be held at Bourbon Cataratas Convention in Foz do Iguaçu, Brazil, from 17 to 22 October 2016. The central topic this year is "Unity and diversity of demographic processes: political challenges for Latin America and the Caribbean in an international perspective". The event received 755 papers from all continent and abroad. Workshops and side meetings will be organized on mobility and climate change, gender and care policies, mortality databases, projections, longitudinal data and big data.
