The demographic dividend is fast gaining traction as a development paradigm among African leaders, who see it as a pathway for sub-Saharan African countries to accelerate their social and economic development. This is especially because the demographic dividend has been partly credited for the transformative development realised by some East Asian countries over the last four decades. These countries were at the same development level as many African countries in the 1960s, but are now high or upper-middle income countries with decent living standards for their citizens.
