Candidates should have a completed PhD, or be working towards completion of a PhD, or have other research experience that demonstrates the capability to produce independent original research in demography, other quantitative social science, epidemiology or related field. You should also have demonstrated competence in data management and the statistical analysis of large scale longitudinal data sets, a track record of contribution to publications, preferably peer reviewed journal articles, and an interest in ageing, life course influences on health in later life or family demography and health. Excellent communication skills, the ability to work in a team and a commitment to developing new skills are required.
