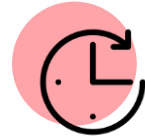

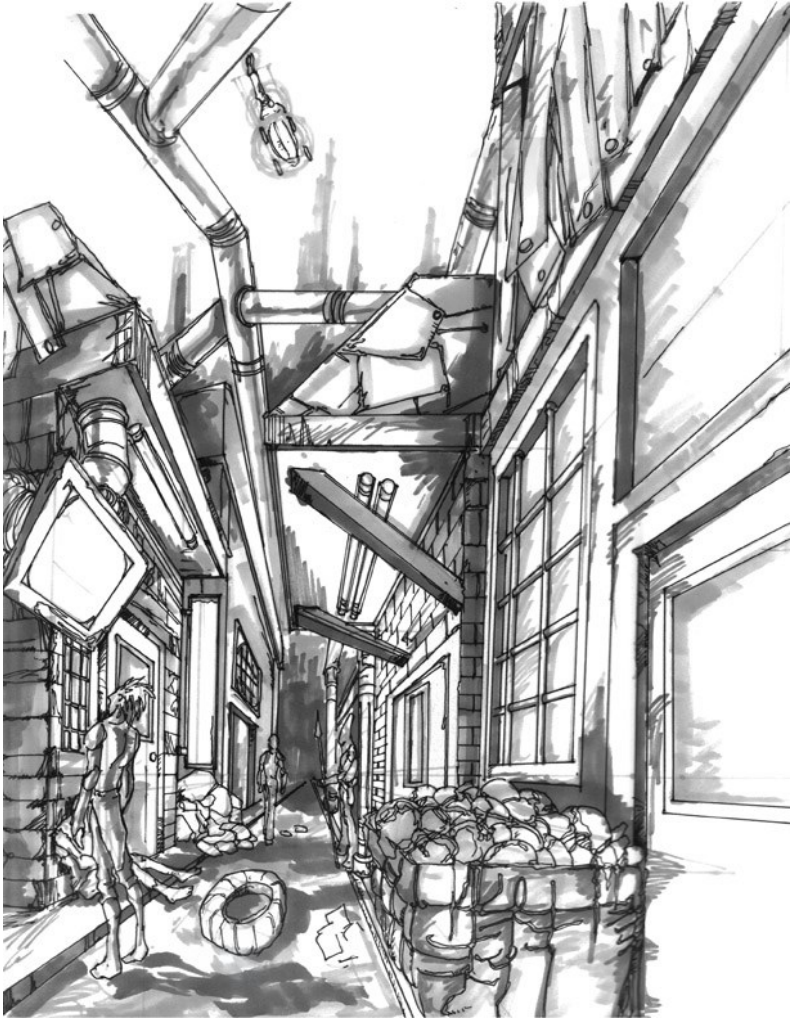
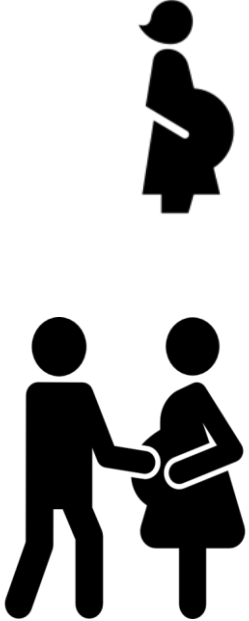

# WHY URBAN SPACES?

- **Increasing urbanization**

1. Today about 55% of the population live in urban spaces

- 70% by 2050 - over 90% of this increase will be in Africa and Asia

2. Hidden unplanned hazardous settlements



# WHY IS THE FOCUS OF FAMILY PLANNING IN URBAN AREAS IMPORTANT?

## •Increased complexity in Urban Health Systems

- Diverse /transient population
- Weak and thin public health care providers
- Growing private health care providers

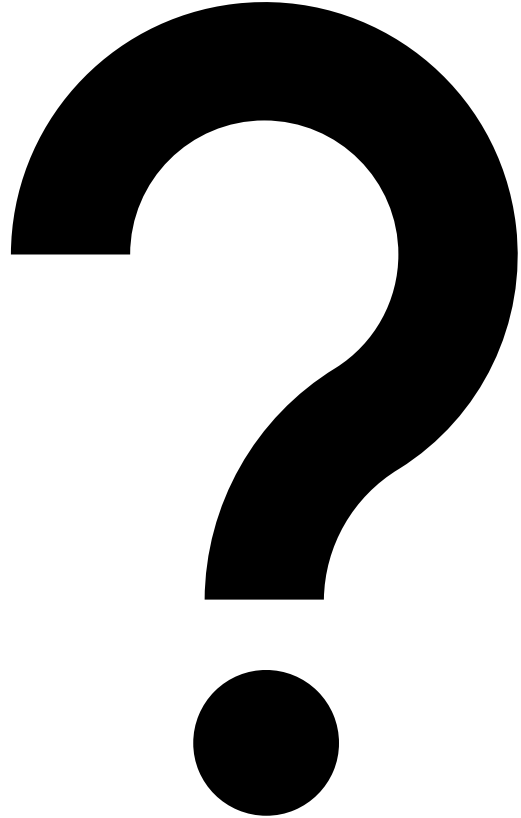

- **Participant selection**

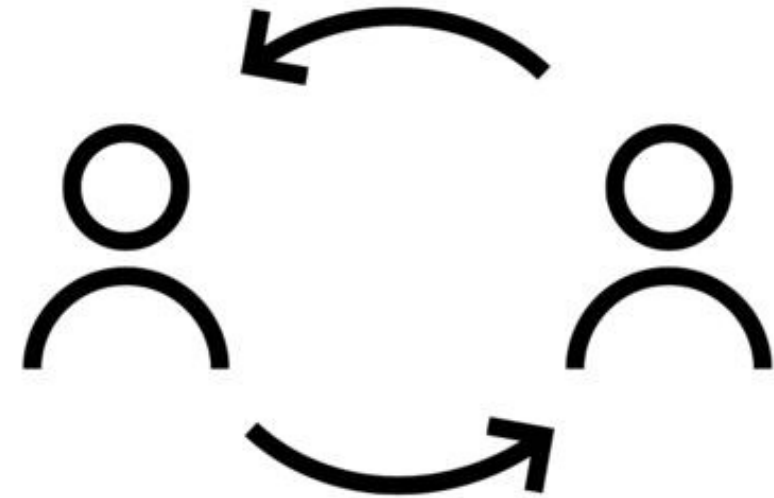
- Study location: Kira municipality, Wakiso, Uganda

- Individual qualitative Interviews

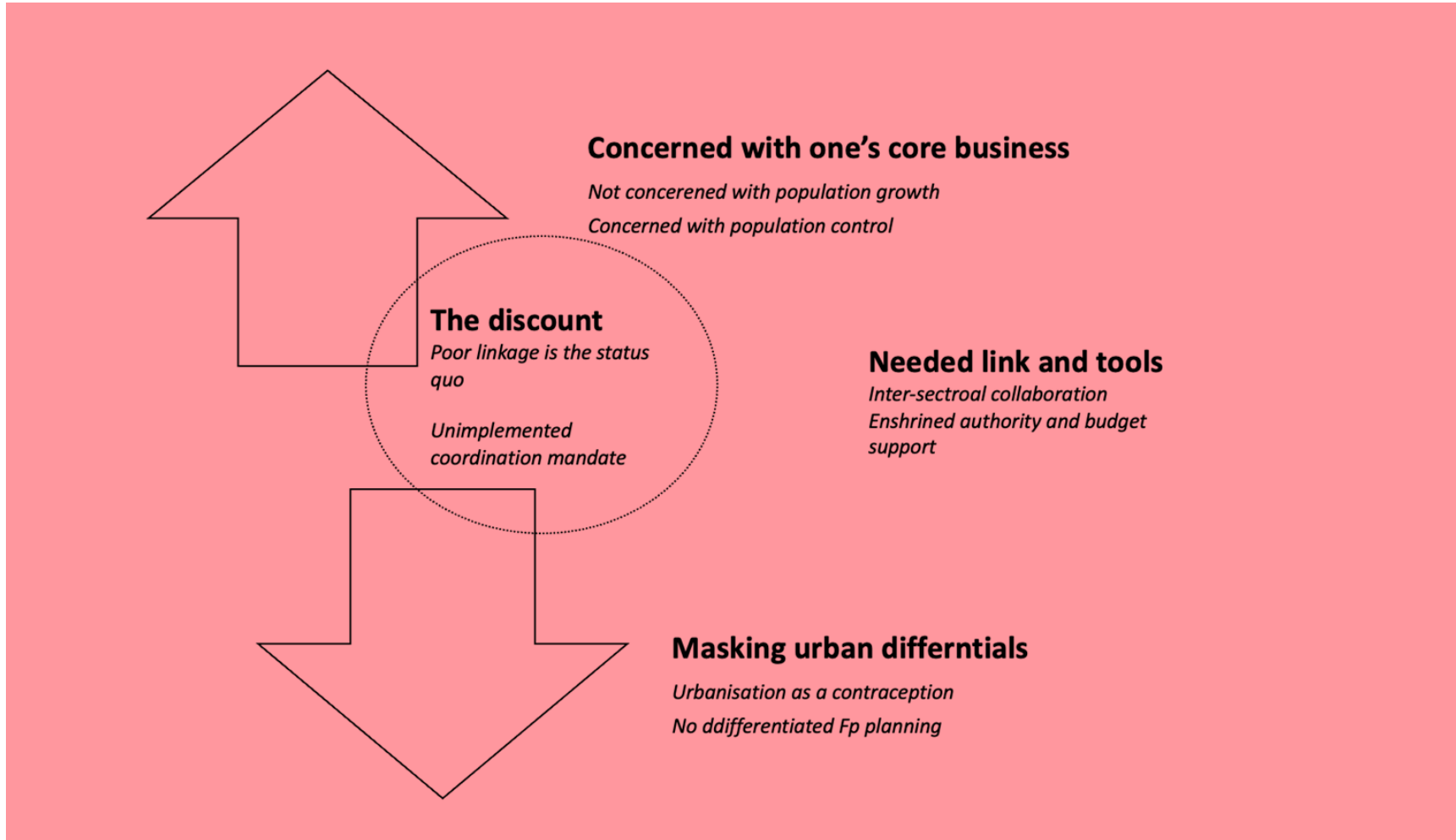
- **Data analysis**

- Thematic analysis



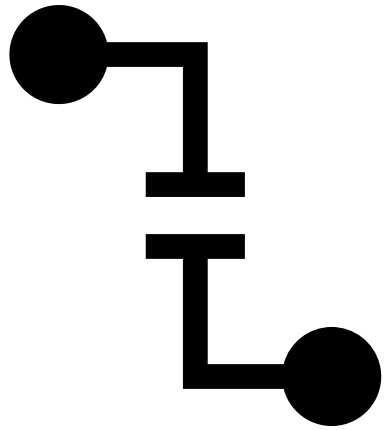

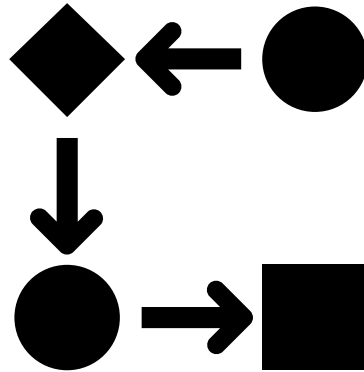

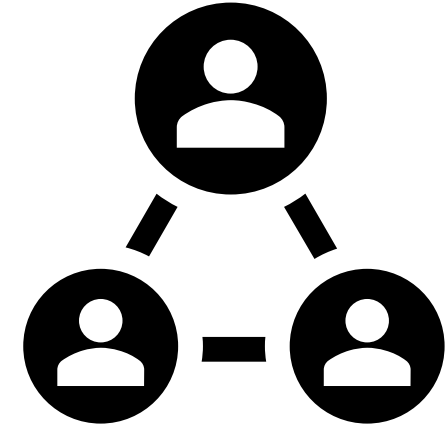
# TAKE AWAYS
