

Guidelines for Poster Presentations

Please notify us immediately at IPC2025@iussp.org if you are unable to attend the meeting or present your poster, so that we make adjustments in the programme.

DEADLINE FOR UPLOADING FULL PAPERS

Poster authors can upload **a completed paper** (**not** the poster) to the Conference programme website (https://ipc2025.popconf.org/) by **30 June.** The uploaded document will replace the extended abstract and will remain on the programme website after the conference.

POSTER PRESENTATION AND DISPLAY SCHEDULE

Posters will be displayed for the full day on which the poster session is assigned to take place, from Monday 14 July to Thursday 17 July. Posters will be grouped by topic. Authors are responsible for setting up their poster at the beginning of the day, ideally before 10:00 am, and removing it at the end of the day*. Each poster will be assigned to a numbered poster board. Refer to the final programme to confirm the board number assigned to your poster presentation. Authors should be present during the poster presentation session (12:00 to 13:30) to discuss findings with participants. In addition, authors can also present during the morning (10:00 -10:30 AM) and afternoon (3:00 - 3:30 PM) coffee breaks.

PRESENTATION PREPARATION

Poster Format:

The poster format for IPC 2025 is **A0 portrait** (841 x 1,189 mm or 33.1 x 46.8 inches). Poster boards will be provided to display poster presentation materials. The board size is 1.2 m wide and 1.8 m high. **The poster size should be no larger than 1.2 m wide.**

- All posters should be based on the submitted abstract as accepted by the Scientific Committee.
- You are encouraged to bring your poster with you. You can also print your poster in Brisbane for about 45 AUD (details will be available soon).

Poster Design

Design your poster so that it is easy to read and includes visuals. Allocate the top of the poster for the title and authors' names and affiliations. Provide a clear and brief overview of your research topic or questions, data and methods, findings, and main conclusions. Consider using bullet points to summarize points and avoid jargon and abbreviations. When possible, highlight your main findings in visually appealing and clear graphs, maps, figures, and charts. Avoid large tables. Carefully proofread your poster before printing. For additional information on developing your Poster presentation, there will be a training webinar early June (more information here).

Engage with the poster visitors and judges. During your 1.5-hour session (12:00 to 13:30), you will have the opportunity to discuss your research with conference attendees and poster judges. Consider developing a 2-minute summary your research and its key findings. Posters will be judged on both content and style, including the importance and innovation of the research questions, visual appeal, organization, and effective written and oral communication of study and findings.

Mounting and Supplies:

Please make sure that the material used for the poster allows it to be posted on the boards. We recommend "Velcro Stickers" to mount your poster, tacks or pushpins. Supplies will be available at the conference center.
