


#### Q7 How many RECORDED "regular" sessions did you view?


## Q8 Do you plan to return to the website during the next month to view additional RECORDED sessions?

#### Q17 9. In which sector do you work?(Tick as many answers as apply)




#### Q18 10. In which region do you reside?
