After the end of the two-year contract, I did post graduate studies in Sweden and then moved to Australia.

The consultancy company had offices in London and Copenhagen, and I worked on site with 17 client companies in Denmark, Sweden and Finland. The work gave substantial experience of the administrative and financial aspects of running various projects in an international atmosphere, including experience in advising senior management. My

engagement with the consultancy company ended when I decided to do extensive travel in North and South America, where I also visited some companies. After my return to Sweden I did another two-week project for the consultancy, and then started studying demography at Lund University and Stockholm University.
