Sureeporn Punpuing is an Associate Professor of the Institute for Population and Social Research, Mahidol University. Her research focuses primarily on population-environment interactions and health and cross-border migration, migration and health. Dr. Punpuing used to work as a Population Affairs Officer at United Nations (Head quarter) in New York city, a consultant for ESCAP, IOM, ILO and WHO in Bangkok, and UNFPA in Mongolia.

Dr. Punpuing has published numbers of articles on urbanization, migration and health, aging, particularly related to different population such as older persons and adolescents. She teaches advanced analysis of migration and human ecology to Masters and Ph.D students. She holds a Bachelor degree in Statistics from Silpakorn University, Thailand; a certificate in Population Sciences from International Institute for Population Studies (IIPS), India; Master's degree in Demography and a Ph.D in Resource and Environmental Sciences from the Australian National University, Australia.
