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A. SUMMARY OF QUALIFICATIONS

Sureeporn Punpuing, Ph.D. is a Professor at the Institute for Population and Social Research (IPSR), Mahidol University, and Director of the Mahidol Migration Center. She served as Director of IPSR from 2008 to 2016, guiding its growth as a leading center for interdisciplinary population research. With over 30 years of academic and policy engagement, her work spans migration, ageing, health, urbanization, and the intersection of population dynamics with environmental change.

Dr. Punpuing holds a Bachelor's degree in Statistics from Silpakorn University, a Certificate in Population Sciences from the International Institute for Population Sciences (India), a Master's in Demography, and a Ph.D. in Resource Management and Environmental Sciences from the Australian National University. Her interdisciplinary training underpins her ability to link demographic research with health, environmental sustainability, and social policy.

She has authored over 60 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters and has served as a consultant for numerous international agencies, including the United Nations, ESCAP, IOM, ILO, WHO in Bangkok, as well as UNFPA in Mongolia. Dr. Punpuing previously worked as a Population Affairs Officer at the United Nations in New York City.

Currently, Dr. Punpuing leads the Kanchanaburi Health and Demographic Surveillance System (HDSS), contributing vital longitudinal data for understanding population health and well-being in Asia and Africa. Her leadership and research have influenced both national policies and global discourse on migration, ageing, and sustainable development.
